

Essay Rubric

A rubric is a tool that experts - often professors and teachers - use to communicate expectations, provide focused feedback, and grade writings and presentations. At ACC, we have developed this rubric to ensure our Essay Resource Team provides consistent and helpful feedback to our students.

When our Team reviews each draft of a Personal Statement or College Essay, they assess:

- Topic
- Opening Hook
- Organization
- Values and Personal Characteristics
- Desired College Traits
- Word Choice
- Sentence Structure
- Conclusory Paragraph
- Mechanics
- Emotional Appeal.
